<u>Purpose:</u> Addressed healthcare disparities by bringing high-quality, free medical services directly to Charlotte County underserved communities.

<u>Collaborations:</u> Strengthened partnerships, to include the Charlotte County Department of Health and Charlotte Behavioral Healthcare to provide comprehensive care.


Service Expansion: Expanded operational three days per week, to five days per week through additional funding.

<u>Community Impact</u>: Provided barrier-free healthcare access, improving health outcomes and reducing emergency room visits.

Recognition: Board of Charlotte County Commissioners received naming rights for the Mobile Medical Clinic in appreciation of their generous support.







Action Taken:

Increased services to 5 days per week & hired part time APRN.

2. Transportation barriers for some patients.

Action Taken:

Charlotte County Transit Service.

Implemented transportation funding for taxi services.




Future Goals & Expansion Plans
