PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, hurricanes are powerful and potentially devastating natural disasters capable of causing loss of life, property damage, and significant disruptions to communities, economies, and infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the Atlantic hurricane season officially begins on June 1 and continues through November 30, with storms frequently developing in the Gulf, the Caribbean Sea, and the Atlantic Ocean; and

WHEREAS, preparedness is essential to protecting lives and minimizing the impact of hurricanes, and it requires the coordinated efforts of government agencies, emergency responders, community organizations, and individual residents, especially those who embody the spirit of neighbors helping neighbors by checking in on one another, sharing resources, assisting with preparations, and offering support; and

WHEREAS, early planning, public awareness, and proactive readiness efforts—including having emergency kits, evacuation plans, knowing your evacuation zone, and staying informed—can greatly reduce risks and enhance community resilience; and

WHEREAS, we honor and recognize the ongoing work of emergency management professionals, first responders, all BOCC county staff, volunteers, community

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that the month of June 2026, shall be known in all of Charlotte County as
