ROBERT "BOB" HOWELL

Responsible for the cost, schedule and execution plan for TEC's Polk Power Station, an Integrated Gasification Combined Cycle (IGCC) project built on a green field site at a cost of \$610M over a seven-year period of development and construction. The project was delivered on schedule and on budget. Also responsible for the DOE 'Continuation Application' covering various budget periods during the project. This activity ensured a continuous funding approval of approximately \$150M.

- Reported and analyzed costs, schedules, and performance during construction, startup and demonstration of the plant. This included DOE audit activities in coordination with the Defense Contract Audit Agency.
- Developed the accounts payable system and managed purchase orders through the interaction of existing systems without increasing staffing or cost. Developed new cost structures and programs to monitor and manage financials for the new technology.
- Created the cost, schedule and execution plan for TEC's Big Bend Station Fluid Gas Desulfurization system (FGD). The project was built for \$82M over a three-year period and arrived under budget and on schedule. Responsible for regulatory support for rate base inclusion.
- Developed the initial project estimate for TEC's Bayside Power Station (repowering of Gannon Station from coal to natural gas) and worked directly with the A/E firm in developing the overall project estimate (over \$700M). Responsible for cost, schedule and execution plans. Developed an innovative database tool to manage costs, structure, and 75 sub-projects within the overall scope. Led a cost savings initiative during construction that accounted for over \$25M in savings.
- Managed the cost of DOE projects at Big Bend Station related to boiler performance.
