**4. What will the grant be used for?**

This is a \$259,154.00 increase in funding to existing FDEP Grant Agreement No. 22CH1 which will bring the total revised FDEP share to \$1,799,087.00. Our Local match funding revised amount is \$3,212,500.66 for a grand total of \$5,011,587.66. Funds will be used for reimbursement of work associated with Charlotte County Erosion Control Project and Manasota Key Beach Restoration Project

**5. Is it for additional or new services/equipment/facilities?**

**6. Does it pay for something that the County already does?**

Yes, Manasota Key is critically eroded extending from Sarasota County to the limit of Charlotte County's prior beach nourishment. Beach nourishment has been ongoing since 2003 along Stump Pass Beach State Park. Several Hurricanes and tropical storms have caused additional damage. A Manasota Key Beach Erosion Study was performed in 2016

**8. Is the County obligated to pay for anything after the grant goes away?**

Sustainability: The recommended strategy to address the critically eroding beaches of Manasota Key is to implement the planned beach management program consisting of initial restoration, and periodic beach nourishment. Estimated annual recurring cost TBD and will consist of Periodic Dredging, beach re-nourishment, and maintenance when required & is ongoing.
