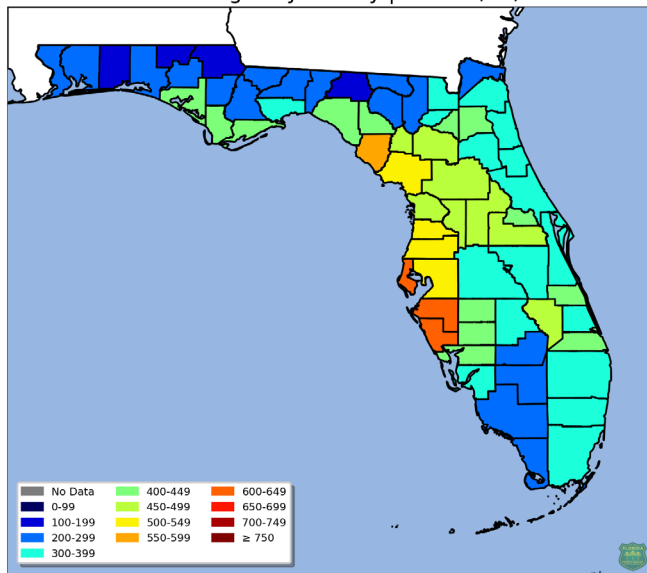

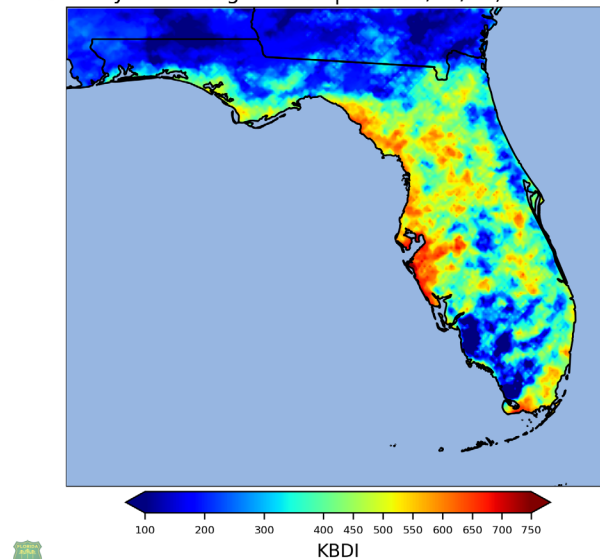
Statewide Keetch-Byram Drought Index (KBDI)

Keetch-Byram Drought Index | Mon 06/29/26, 02:00 PM EDT



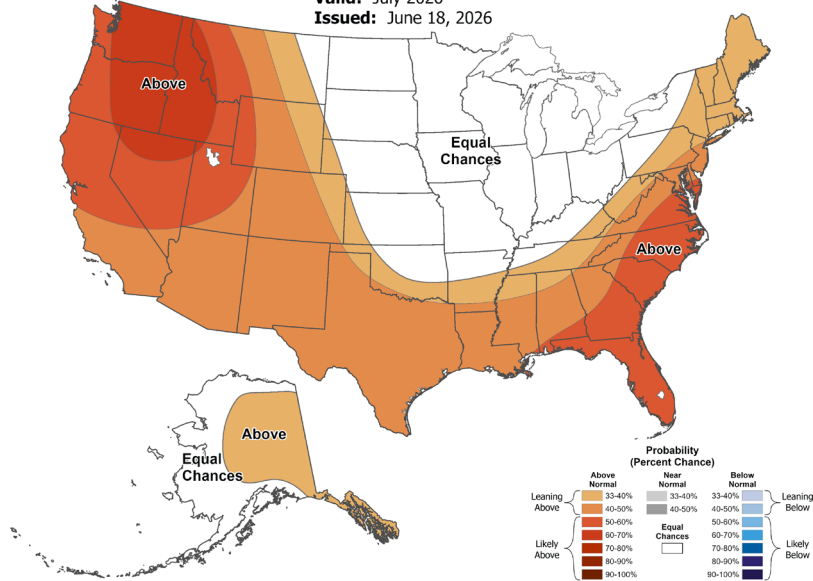

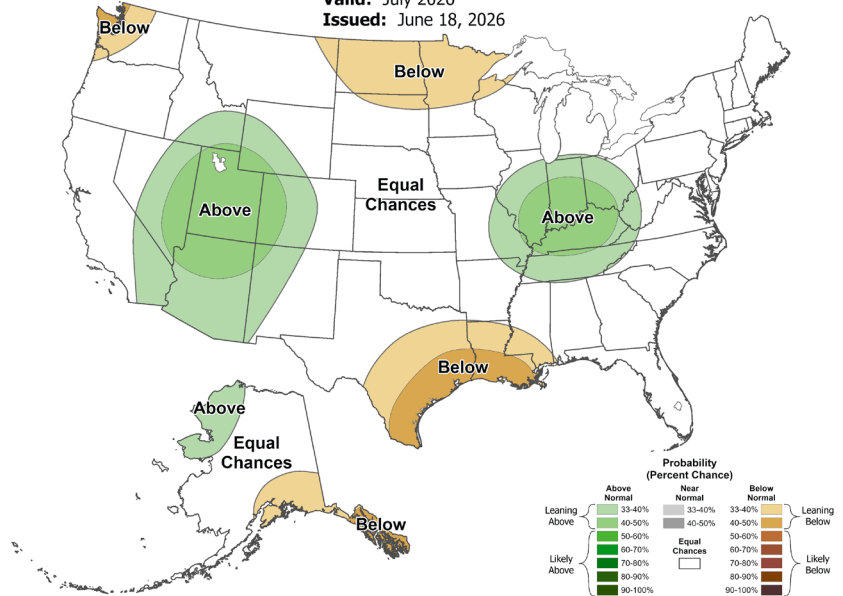
Monthly Temperature Outlook

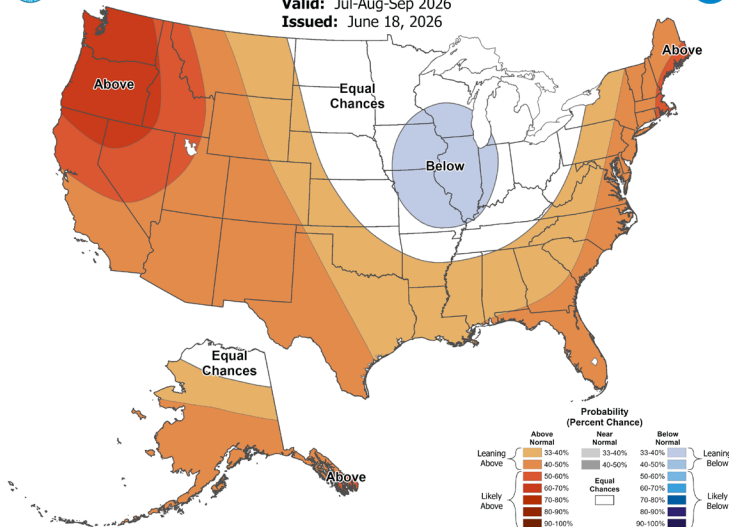
Seasonal Outlook

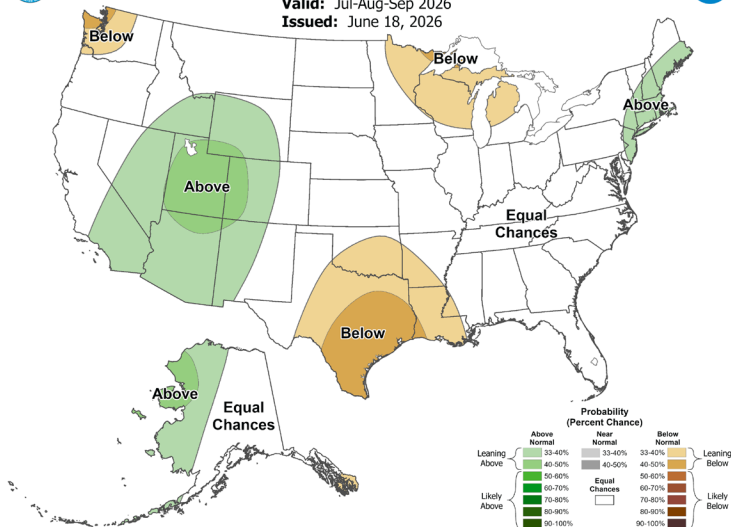
Seasonal Temperature Outlook

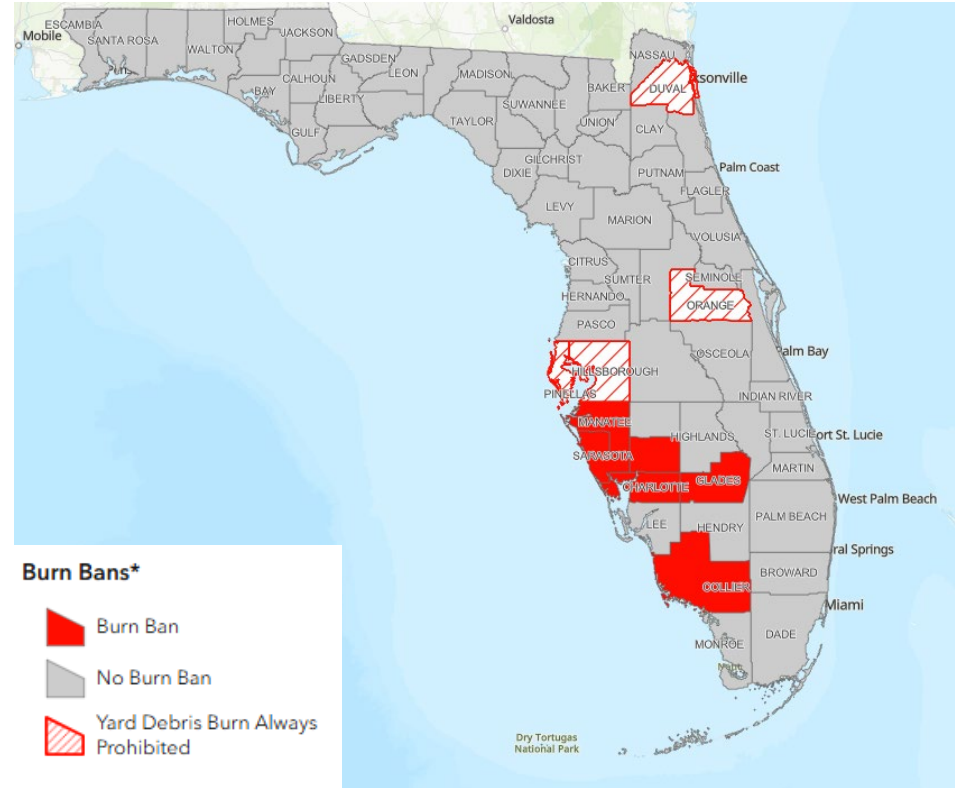


County Enacted Bans

Forecast/Outlook Impacts

Improved weather conditions mean

- Recent rainfall, higher humidity, and lighter winds have reduced fire ignition and spread potential.
- Current fuel and weather conditions are more favorable than when the burn ban was enacted.
- The immediate threat to life, property, and public health from large wildfire activity has decreased.
- Charlotte County Fire & EMS will continue to monitor conditions closely and will recommend renewed restrictions if fire danger increases.

Based on current forecast, fuel conditions, operational readiness, and consultation with Forestry, rescinding the countywide burn ban is warranted at this time.
