## 1. How much funding will the Department/County receive from the grant?

Amendment 1 will provide \$4,913,221.00 in additional funding from FDEP to Task 1 Construction, for a new grand total of \$12,715,395.00 in construction tasks funded by FDEP.

2. Is there a County match required? If yes, identify type and source.

Match is required and will be supplied by the West Coast Inland Navigation District (WCIND), Tourist Development Council, Boater Improvement Fund, Stump Pass/Beach Renourishment MSBU, Don Pedro Knight Island MSTU, Stump Pass MSTU, and The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

3. How many years have we been receiving this grant?

We have been receiving this grant since 2003, approximatly 17 years .

4. What will the grant be used for?

Grant in place and being used for the Charlotte County Erosion Control project design, construction, and monitoring of 2.3 miles of shoreline between DEP monuments R28-R40.5, Restoration of 3.9 miles of shoreline between R1-R21.2 in Charlotte County, and restoration of 2.0 miles of shoreline between R172.9-R183.7 in Sarasota County.
