#### Requested Motion/Action

#### Department Making Request

#### Community Development

Approve a Final Plat for a subdivision to be named, Babcock Ranch Community Crescent Lakes Phase 1. They are also seeking approval of a Developer's Agreement and surety to cover the construction of the plat infrastructure. The proposed subdivision is a residential development to consist of 193 single-family lots and 16 tracts with supporting utility, roadway, and stormwater infrastructure. The site contains 111.47± acres is generally located south of Bermont Road, north of the County line with Lee County, west of the County line with Glades County and east of Bluebird Trail. The site is located within the boundary of the Babcock Ranch Community Development of Regional Impact (DRI) Increment 2, the East County area. Located in Commission District I.
